Colquitt County is a rural community located in South Georgia. Agriculture is our main industry. Our population is approx. 45,600 with a median household income of \$35,472. Approximately 25.2% of the citizens are at or below poverty level. Our district is considered Title I and all students receive benefits from the free lunch program. Currently the district consists of 10 Elementary schools, 1 Middle School (6&7), 1 Junior High school (8&9) and 1 High School (10-12). We offer specialty programs for gifted, virtual, and at-risk students.

### Colquitt County COVID-19 Policy

Due to state and community health concerns, Colquitt County School district ended face to face instruction on March 2020. We are a rural town with areas throughout the county have limited internet capabilities. In addition, the district was not able to provide all students with an electronic device. Because of the various situations, the high school decided to make online classes optional. The exception was for AP students and with failing grades. These students were required to continue their education lessons. All other students were given the option to remediate previous lessons to earn a higher grade or accept their current grade. No new material was covered for these students and there was no penalty for not completing any other work. Note: 20-21 school year: Students had the option of face to face instruction or remote/online instruction.

All students are given the opportunity to take an AP course. Students enrolled in AP courses are expected to take the corresponding exam.

# Curriculum Information

CCHS is on a year –long schedule where students take 7 classes each day. Yearlong scheduling was instituted in 2019. An individual program is developed for each student, and courses are offered at varying levels of difficulty. Students may choose either College Prep., Advanced/Honors Prep, Advanced Placement and/or Dual Enrollment. The AP offering and availability vary each year. Because of this, CCHS considers both academic Dual enrollment and AP courses as the most rigorous courses available. Students have the option of taking Georgia Virtual School (GAVS) courses.
