

© Be sure to get to the bus stop in plenty of time. **Five minutes before the bus comes** is plenty of time to talk with your friends, and be there in time for the bus.

© If you leave too late you have too rush, like this big fella to the right. It is much easier to trip and fall when you are rushing.






- Make sure the bus is stopped before you try to get on.

  There is up to 6 tons of school bus rolling down the road towards you, and we don't want you slipping under the wheels.
- © After the bus stops and the door opens then you take firm hold of the handrail and get onto the bus. Be careful here, too! It's a big step for a little person.
- Never push while getting on or off the bus.
- © When you get on the bus go right to your seat and sit quietly. The driver can't keep asking a whole lot of kids to behave and concentrate on driving the bus safely at the same time. Pretend you are out with your parents, driving in the car, and make them proud of you!
- © **Obey the driver as you would your parents**. Your bus driver is just as concerned with your safety as they are. When the driver ask you to do something or stop doing something, don't talk back or make a fuss. There's good reason for it.
- © See how clear the aisle is on this bus to the right? Make sure all your things are securely zipped up in something like a backpack, and kept on your lap during the bus ride.
- © Be sure to keep all parts of your body **inside the bus at all times.** You shouldn't be waving or sticking you head outside the window.





- © Behave yourself at the bus stop. You won't be completely safe from traffic unless you stand way back from the curb, and don't push or wrestle with your friends. Stay put, and then line up nicely when the bus comes.
- © Be sure to listen to any adults supervising at the bus stop.
- © The bus driver should be able to see you at all times when you are getting on or off of the bus.
- © If you have to cross the street to get on or off the bus you will have to pass in front of the crossing gate.
- © If you stay on the side of the street you get out on when you leave the bus, be sure to get well away from the bus.
- © If you have to cross the street when getting on or off the bus be sure to take ten steps forward from the front of the bus before crossing, (follow the arrows in the bus to our right).
- © The driver has a good view of the road from way up in their seat. Watch the driver to see when to cross the road. If you have a safety patroller, follow your patroller's direction.
